

## SWIMMING AT LAKE BARRINGTON

Rowing Tasmania is well aware that many competitors enjoy a swim after competition, particularly on a hot day. Due to past actions of swimmers however, the Rowing Tasmania imposes the following basic rules for swimming at Lake Barrington:

- Murfett's Bay, to the North of the Boat Park, is the designated swimming area. This is the only designated area during hours of competition.
- There is to be no swimming in Davey's Bay, to the South of the Finish, in the area of the Turning Circle Jetty or the launch pontoons. However swimming off the launch pontoons may be permitted outside of competition times provided they stay well clear of rowing craft.
- Swimmers do so at their own risk
- No swimmer is to venture onto the precincts of the course
- No swimmer is to climb onto any course structure (they are not permitted out there anyhow!)
- Junior swimmers should be supervised by Club/School adult persons
- **No swimmer is in any way to interfere with a crew or sculler – i.e. no swimmer is to attempt to hold onto an oar or boat of a crew or sculler, to approach or in any way to hinder a crew or sculler.**
- It should be remembered that there are submerged logs and trees in the Lake. Diving into the Lake is not recommended.
- Any breach of these basic rules will be referred to the executive of Council for disciplinary action. Penalties can include removal from the venue, removal of entries from future events and monetary fines.

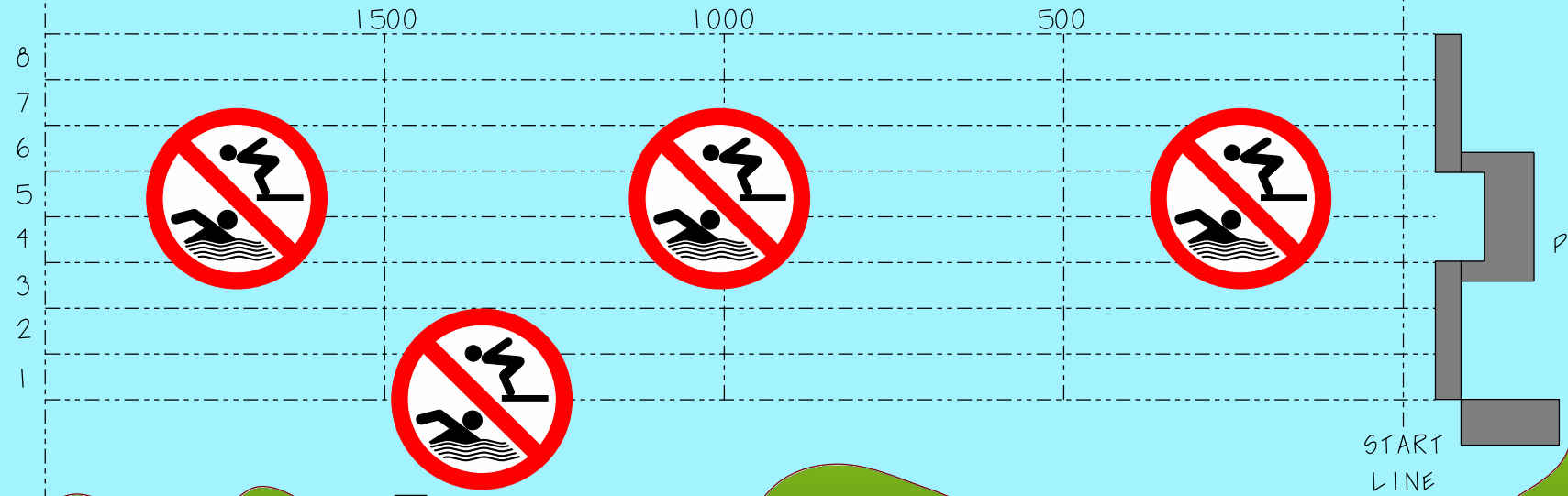
These basic rules are imposed for the safety of all, prevention of interference to power boat movements, prevention of interference with crews and scullers on the water and prevention of damage to property.
